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# 1. Policy and operational highlights of the year

## 1.1. Policy and operational highlights

No Operational or Strategic committees were organised in 2022 due to the transitional nature of the political year with the change of governments.

Gustavo Petro's government has set out to make peace an overarching priority, seeking to achieve "Total Peace" in the country. This entails implementing the 2016 Peace Agreement in full, opening negotiations with the Ejército Liberación Nacional (ELN) and building channels towards the many other armed groups active in Colombia. Ultimately, this also means solving social and territorial inequalities, which are the main reasons for the violence in the country. Political, technical, and financial support to the implementation of the Peace Agreement remains key for Colombia's Government.

During the new government's relatively long period of launching its political agenda, the EU and its Member States have maintained constant dialogue with National Agencies, which play an important role in peace activities. The EU together with EUMS are well placed to accompany peace efforts with short and long term measures, based on experience from e.g. the EU Trust Fund.

The EU Trust Fund has heavily contributed to the visibility and success of EU support to Colombia's peace efforts over the last six years. This innovative set-up allowed for efficient pooling of EU and EUMS resources, agility in formulating projects responding to the needs of the peace process both locally and nationally, and strong government involvement in project management. The EUTF has been widely appreciated by the Colombian government, participating EU and non-

EU states and beneficiaries, particularly rural communities and former combatants in reincorporation. The mechanism has developed its potential in terms of EU coordination, agility, visibility and political dialogue. Although implementation continues, no more funds have been added since 2021 and no further contracts have been signed, in line with the overall approach of phasing out trust funds and other ad-hoc financing instruments.

In depth strategic and legal discussions with EUMS and Government of Colombia on the EU future support to the peace process have led to the conclusion that a Team Europe Initiative provides a good basis for coordination and should continue to be pursued, but no other instrument provides the same level of political leverage and operational versatility as the EUTF.

Petro's election has led to a reconfiguration of Peace agencies and policies in the country. This process has affected EUTF interventions, particularly budget disbursements, delaying changing indicators and influencing policy dialogue. Land ownership as part of the Comprehensive Land Reform is a priority for Petro's Government. The newly appointed Director of the National Land Agency (ANT) has expressed the need to speed up the process of land formalisation with digital technologies and to ensure a stronger state presence in the territories. This new requirements need to be adjusted in the complementary support that the EU is providing to the Agency.

Until the end of 2021, EU Member States, UK and Chile contributed with EUR 37 M, corresponding to 29 % of the total amount of the EUTF.

# 1.2. Summary of programmes adopted and current pipeline

No new programmes were adopted during 2022.

Six new contracts were signed during **2022** (T06.98, T06.99, T06.100, T06.101, T06.102, T06.104), for a total amount of **386.435 EUR.** Four contracts regard expenditure verification, one is an audit and one the mid-term evaluation.

Sixteen contracts were concluded until December 2022. On the 31st December 2022, the EUTF contained 36 ongoing contracts including the operational/audit and expenditure verification ones.

### 1.3. Obstacles encountered

As in previous years, the **security situation** in many of the areas of intervention of the EUTF was a challenge for implementing partners. Threats against and assassination of social leaders, human rights defenders and former combatants affected the implementation of some of the projects. As before, this issue has been a regular topic in the dialogue between the Delegation and the Government of Colombia.

The government requested the neutralisation of two indicators of the Sector Reform Performance Contract "Land and Sustainable Territories for Peace", and the transfer of the corresponding amount to the next variable tranche of 2023. The government justified this request because of the increased insecurity and the presence of armed groups in the territory that had prevented the presence of the National Land Agency teams.

The transition period between the two governments, has affected EUTF implementation. The new government has taken time to appoint new directors of Peace Agencies, and they are still preparing for carrying out the "Total Peace" Policy.

# 1.4. Particular risks associated with the management of EUTF programmes

Parliamentary and Presidential elections in the first half of the year and the change of Government in August have distracted some partners, especially institutional ones, from implementation of projects or significant policy dialogue. Meanwhile, violence traditionally spikes around elections, posing additional challenges to implementing partners throughout the country.

# 2. Programming, implementation and results, including evaluations

## 2.1. Brief description of programmes adopted

No new programmes were adopted in 2022.

## 2.2. Monitoring and lessons learnt

The EUTF team carried out several monitoring field visits of projects during 2022.

Moreover, two projects received external "ROM" visits (Result Oriented Monitoring), which complemented the information submitted by implementing partners every three months.

In 2022, a mid-term evaluation of the EUTF was launched with the aim of generating inputs to guide further interventions; regarding the efficient use of resources and taking-stock of lessons learned that could be capitalised in constructing the Team Europe Initiative for Peace in Colombia. The analysis covered the period from the beginning of the EUTF's operations in January 2017 until June 2022.

The evaluation coincided with the run-off of the presidential elections, limiting access to civil servants of the previous Government who had played a relevant role in the EUTF implementation.

The principal findings of the evaluation are the following:

- The Fund contributed to positioning the EU as a key political actor in the international community's efforts to support the implementation of the Final Peace agreement.
- The EU political commitment, and the adaptability of the EUTF to respond to national priorities, clearly played a catalytic role in implementing the Peace Agreement. It also contributed to maintaining the validity of the Agreement, which has been under attack from political opponents since it came into force.
- The EUTF has been a valuable instrument for coordinating cooperation. The interventions supported by the EUTF have offered agile responses to the priority demands of the Government and target groups regarding compliance with Points 1 and 3.2 of the Peace Agreement, highlighting the relevance of projects strengthening the institutional response to reincorporation and access to land.
- The EUTF's initial objectives gave it a wide-ranging and long-term mandate. The
  combination of far-reaching goals with actions focused on responding to immediate
  needs of ex-combatants returning to civilian life, gave rise to a complex portfolio of
  interventions not necessarily centred on a common strategy.
- The magnitude and complexity of structural reforms needed, widely surpasses responsibility and resources of international cooperation. As a result, interventions covered a wide range of target groups, geographical areas, activities and products. A specific Theory of Change and a corresponding chain of results would have enabled greater focus.
- The regular presence of the EUTF and high-level visits of diplomatic representatives,

offered political backing and a sense of protection for local actors committed to the peace process.

- The inclusion of different target groups in the same project created opportunities for dialogue and mutual understanding, increasing confidence between different actors and establishing foundations for reconciliation.
- The EUTF has systematically supported a differential approach focused on including youth, women and ethnic groups.
- The report highlights the need to differentiate short term measures, to respond to immediate needs of reincorporation, using humanitarian aid principles and strategies, with measures focused on medium and long-term reincorporation, which require longer time and greater articulation with the national and sectoral development plans.
- It is recommended to work with each implementing partner on exit strategies, indicating who will provide continuity to the activities, to ensure that the results obtained are maintained.
- It is suggested to provide continuity to the peace education efforts, and reinforce the communication strategy with El Espectador and community broadcasters articulating efforts to better disseminate initiatives carried out with the EUTF, around a common message of peace.
- The report underlines the need to stimulate the creation and signing of environmental preservation agreements in the territories where the EUTF intervenes to restore natural resources.

### 2.3. Main achievements of the EUTF

To obtain a consolidated overview of the EUTF actions, targets and results of the projects of the Trust Fund have been grouped in six main Strategic Pillars. Below, the main indicators and a short qualitative example for each Strategic Pillar are presented.


# Reconciliation of indigenous population, victims, and peace signees in Caldono, Cauca

"The EUTF has supported a project aimed at reconciliation between exexcombatants and indigenous populations in the municipality of Caldono, Cauca". This experience encouraged dialogue, and allowed the reconstruction of collective historical memory. Reconciliation exercises provided moments for emotional unloading, contributing to reduce prevailing tensions, ensuring mutual acknowledgement of parties in the conflicto, and reaffirming willingness for reconciliation and non-repetition. One of the leaders of Cerro de Belén testifies: "This exercise helped us to put words on the stories we had kept inside, and rememorize whatever was left of the conflict among young people, women, men, ex-combatants, people from indigenous councils, everyone. We rebuild a relation of peace and trust, and tried to leave behind the psychological damage, the imprint of the guerrilla". This experience brought tolerance and peaceful cohabitation and transformed the preconceived visión of Caldono, eliminating the stigma previosly felt by the population.

## Strengthening of Departmental and Municipal Boards for Effective Participation of Victims in Nariño

The EUTF implemented a capacity building strategy to ensure an Effective Participation of the Victims (MPEV) in the boards of the municipalities of Ipiales, Pasto, Tumaco and the Department of Nariño. The EUTF accompanied them in the elaboration of their work plans in alignment with departmental and municipal development plans, as well as encouraging advocacy actions regarding the assignment of public resources for their implementation. The Boards were equipped with informatic devices, and training was provided to improve their performance. The experience of the School for Leadership and Peace Building, is currently scaled up by the Government of Nariño in seven other municipalities. Board's members are currently exercising their rights and they are gaining access to social programs. "Good things have been accomplished with the Secretariat of Education. They now annually give a school kit (notebook, pen, books, etc.) to the boys and girls", says a representative of the MPEV from Pasto. This strengthening process promoted the election of a member of de Board of Tumaco to occupy one of the Peace Seats reserved for victim population in the Chamber of Representatives as part of the peace agreement. In Ipiales, actions with public institutions were prioritized to face problems identified thanks to a previous exercise of socioeconomic characterization of victim population. Overall, dialogue between victim communities and public institutions was improved. The result of this is the approval of the MPEV annual plans of the MPEV in a quicker manner, as well as an important increase in public resources assigned to these plans, which have tripled.





#### Professionalization of the Multiactive Cooperative Ecomun "Jaime Pardo Leal"

The strengthening of administrative and financial skills of the Cooperative COOJAPAL in the spaces for training and reintegration in Colinas, in Guaviare Department, contributed to the implementation of good accounting and tax practices, as well as transparent, rigorous, and fully documented procurement processes, increasing their legitimacy in the territory. COOJAPAL won two EUTF work tenders because of the quality of their offer, and the fact that they included hiring local workforce. Throughout both contracts, they fulfilled all technical, administrative, and financial obligations, generating employment for 16 people during 5 months. After these successful ventures, the cooperative continued to bid for public tenders for community works. They recently won one in Leticia, in the Amazonas, and were selected by the International Organization for Migration (IOM), to construct one part of a sewer system in the surrounding of Calamar, Guaviare. An agent from the ARN explained: "They trusted COOJAPAL; all the works turned out very well and complied with all IOM requirements, they worked quickly and responded with high-quality results". COOJAPAL is building a portfolio of clients, and they could become a competitive company at regional and national level, with the experience gained with the EUTF.

# Cooperative Nueva Esperanza (New Hope Cooperative), a promising initiative in commercialization of coconut

With the aim to boost coconut production, the Cooperative Nueva Esperanza, led by people in process of reincorporation in Tumaco, improved their managerial, administrative and commercial skills, and built a collection center in the region of Río Mejicano. Besides, they signed their first long term agreement with a purchasing company. They increased coconut sales from 14 tons in 2021 to 56,4 tons in 2022. The legal representative of the Cooperative states, "What we have achieved through this commercial venture is a fair and sure market, allowing to give better prices to our producers". Today, this venture enables the creation of three positions (commercial advisor, warehouse assistant, administrative and accounting assistant). Additionally, the need to respond to sales agreements, encourages the hiring of labor to harvest, collect, peel, and select coconut. The Cooperative has earned legitimacy in the territory, several producers from the community have gradually approached the initiative which now has 33 former combatants and 41 rural families. The Cooperative Nueva Esperanza has now a key role as buyer, collector, and marketer in the coconut value chain.


#### Chocoamazonic: a dream come true for women from Caquetá

Chocoamazonic is an organization made up of 15 women from El Paujil and La Montañita, in Caquetá. Its focus is cocoa transformation. The EUTF supported the strengthening of their organizational, administrative, technical, and productive skills through technical assistance. Additional support was given to construct a cocoa transformation plant and to improve commercialization and packaging design. To this day, the organization has quadrupled its monthly volume of transformed cocoa, reaching an average of 400 kg and diversifying their products with chocolate bars, powdered cocoa, cocoa butter and bonbons with the highest quality standards, generating a 30% increase in profitability in 2021. This has allowed to employ four persons working 15 days per month, a fourfold increase of wages, continued improvement of plant facilities and proactivity in terms of marketing e.g. by attending fairs and similar events. Chocoamazonic has been able to position itself as a key actor by promoting quality in the price, assisting women in the improvement of post-harvest practices and facilitating the articulation between suppliers with public support programs boosting production. Besides, women have been empowered, have gained economic autonomy and their position in the family has improved. One member of the association states: "There is no money to be made in homemaking... at home you work, but what you get is what your husband gives you. Now, I work and I contribute, I feel capable, useful. He has no part in it, on the contrary, he says to me: those are your savings, so I go and buy whatever I need".

# Stronger community network for prevention, detection and first response of gender-based violence

The EUTF helped strengthen the capability for prevention, detection and primary care for women victims of gender-based violence (GBV) of 25 female community leaders belonging to 17 organizations based in 7 municipalities in Putumayo. They autonomously replicated this training in their own communities, reaching a total 100 women and 4 men. By having deeper knowledge of their rights, women in the communities have lost fear to address the subject in public and in their family spheres. "People nowadays know that cases of GBV must be denounced, (...) there was a lot of violence from the war in this municipality (...). And women thought violence in their homes was violence they could not denounce", explains the female leader from the municipality of Orito. Blame of the victims was reduced and trust and solidarity between women increased. Trained female leaders have developed action to raise awareness about gender-based violence reaching other women and young people. Until September 2022, 63 women had been assisted by providing them orientation about their rights, attention routes and, when necessary, psychosocial support. 45 women, received attention from "gender duos" (professional psychologists and lawyers) providing them with information on the cases and avoiding their re-victimization.





### Sustainable livestock practices reducing pressure on natural resources

With the aim to mitigate productive and economic vulnerability of livestock farmers in the north of Putumayo, and to improve efficiency of productive practices, the EUTF trained 136 families and supported five pilot silvopastoral farms. Sanitary and milking practices were improved, reducing the presence of bacteria in the milk by more than 90%. A total of 390 hectares shifted to a more sustainable farming model dividing paddocks with live fences. Planted trees have improved animal wellbeing providing shade and producing organic materials. There is evidence that livestock farming can be carried out without deforestation, and these practices help to regenerate ecosystems. As one of the beneficiaries stated: "now grass lasts longer and we have to cut down less from the mountains". The rotation of paddocks also helped to improve soils quality, thus increasing the nutritional value of the grass. The quality of forage for the herd was maintained throughout the most adverse climatic periods. All the above resulted in an increased efficiency and production in pilot farms, increasing from an average of 0.5L daily per cow to 1.1L, and a daily increase in steer weight from 0.46kg in average to between 0.8kg and 1kg, thus proving that increased productivity and good environmental practices can be combined.

### Sustainable transformation of canangucha to preserve ecosystems

The Association of Rural Women of Colombia and Caquetá (ASMUCOCA) created in 2013, made up of 180 women from La Montañita in Caquetá, produces and commercializes non – timber products, and since 2017 they harvest "canangucha". In collaboration with the University of Amazonía, the EUTF encouraged capacity building and technical assistance to train these women in the sustainable harvesting of this palm, monitoring canangucha production and managing licenses to harvest 40,2 hectares. Additionally, farms were equipped with cables to improve harvesting, and women in the association were given security equipment to avoid accidents during the process. Today, women from ASMUCOCA see the canangucha as an ecosystem with economic and environmental potential. The President of ASMUCOCA explains: "Now we are all taking care of the canangucha trees. People no longer burn; they no longer fumigate the surroundings (...) We want to protect and keep protecting". The women from ASMUCOCA are nowadays sharing their experiences with other productive associations, thus becoming key actors promoting sustainable development in their territories.

#### Access to water in rural communities of Tumaco

The EUTF contributed to the improvement of local water management which has been complemented with other public initiatives in Tumaco, Nariño. The EUTF supported the municipal Water and Sanitation Board, improving data for decision making in territorial planning. With the aim to improve access to water in rural areas, two aqueducts were built benefitting 344 people in two villages, increasing public services in Tumaco from 6.84% up to 8.37% and decreasing diarrheal diseases in infants under the age of 5, to around 85%. "Before, water was collected from the sewage, it was contaminated and we had stomach problems. With the aqueduct, the children not only from my family but from the whole community no longer have such problems", explains the President of the community Water Board. Also, aqueducts helped to reduce the price families pay for water, each family currently pays COP 10.000 per month (approximately 2,5 euro). These resources help to pay the salary of the person in charge of maintaining the infrastructure. Traditionally women are being responsible for providing water to their families, training on technical, organizational aspects were provided, and women led the organization of two community Water Boards and managed the construction of two aqueducts. One of the results of these community-managed aqueduct systems has been solving issues related to seasonal water availability.

### Encouraging local governance in Guaviare

The EUTF supported five Community Action Boards (CAB) in the municipalities of Calamar, El Retorno and San José del Guaviare, providing them with training, technical and financial assistance (around EUR 435.000) for land planning in 259 plots. Community organizations improved their administrative and management skills and improved accountability. This had an effect on the increase of the Organizational Capacity Index11, from an average 69,5 to 81,5. Additionally, CABs have incorporated transparency and community participation in all their decision-making processes. The President of the CAB in Las Colinas points out "The CAB has strengthened their legitimacy because they responded to community requirements. Now they organize meetings and working days with us, as well as bazaars for collecting funds for the community". Participative management of resources, including quality control on purchases by the community, has allowed them to have more confidence and reach public entities. Four CABs of Calamar and El Retorno have been supported with municipal and international cooperation subsidies to develop productive projects and social initiatives, such as milk transformation, the maintenance of tertiary roads, training offers and the implementation of spaces for recreation.

The Organizational Capacity Index (OCI) is a diagnostic tool to measure an organization's capacity in diverse fields related to the EUTF. This tool is applied at the beginning and the end of organizational strengthening activities.



### PILLAR 6: ADDED VALUE OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

The EUTF has transferred specific expertise and experience from EU and EU Member States such as:

- FORLAND, an European tool (open-source platform, dedicated to territorial planning monitoring and decision support), adopted by the Governorate of Guaviare.
- LEADER approach, putting forward European added values related to the promotion of alternative energies, ecotourism, green business and biotrade, river basin development, youth and volunteering, and innovation and technology.
- The focus on commercialisation and markets, achieving the adoption of agricultural practices and certification models complying with European Standards.

The added value of the EUTF relies in two areas: in the political sphere, it has served as an effective platform for the dissemination of democratic values and the principles on which the construction of a lasting peace is based; and in the technical field it has contributed to the strengthening of capacities of the executing and co-executing entities.





## 2.4. EUTF Visibility

In 2022, EUFT communication focussed on two strategic pillars: **reducing conflict and reconciliation** and social **reincorporation of ex-members of FARC-EP.** 

With the aim of visualizing the stories and faces behind the peace process, the event 'Putumayo: a place of reconciliation and hope' was organised. It demonstrated various activities building peace, being spearheaded by communities in the region. In 2019 "Nosotras y El Tigre de Putumayo" ("Women and El Tigre, Putumayo") was released. This booklet accompanied by photos vividly illustrates the experiences and suffering of 12 female victims of the massacre committed in El Tigre police district in 1999. Over the course of 2020 and 2021, the virtual exhibition "Bosquesinas Campesinas" was aired, showcasing the actions for peace and stewardship of the Amazon Rainforest in Putumayo led by female signatories of the peace agreement and female rural workers.

'Putumayo: a place of reconciliation and hope' was attended by Francia Márquez, Vice-President of Colombia, Bertrand, EU Ambassador to Colombia, the Ambassadors of EU Member States, national allies, representatives of the media, the authorities and important organisations in the region ('Tejedoras de Vida' Regional Women's Alliance and 'Violetas de Paz' Women's Association), in addition to young members of the 'Tejedoras de Vida' feminist Batucada percussion band and of the Hosts for Peace programme. It was viewed as the largest communication event organised by the European Union delegation in Colombia

in 2022, portraying Putumayo as a resilient region determined to fight for peace, thus helping to break down prevailing stereotypes about this region. At the same time, it strengthened the position of the European Union as an important ally for building peace in Colombia.

Regarding the social reinsertion of exmembers of FARC-EP, support was given to make the documentary 'La Montaña', produced by signatories of the peace agreement, who are also members of the 'Miradas Collective'. It shows the collective process of integration into civilian life by signatories of the peace agreement from the former Territorial Training and Reinsertion Space in Anorí, a municipality located in the north-east of Antioquia. EUTF similarly provided support for screening this documentary in the Cinematheque of Bogota, which was attended by the former President of Colombia and Nobel Peace Prize Laureate Juan Manuel Santos, the European Union Ambassador to Colombia, recognised professionals in the art and audio-visual sector, and peace signatories from different parts of the country. This event showed the actual people involved in the reinsertion process in Anorí and also gave impetus to publicising and positioning the Miradas Collective as a creative and innovative force for social and economic reinsertion of signatories of the peace agreement.

The EUTF published **37 articles** on its website during year. Moreover, it recorded **71,701 visits**, 38,104 logins and 23,138 users.

# 4. Management and internal control

### 4.1 Control results

# 4.1.1. Control effectiveness as regards legality and regularity

#### 4.1.1.1. Results of ex-ante controls

Ex-ante controls demonstrated be effective with €384,133 of undue payments identified, representing 1.99% of the total amount paid in 2022 for EUTF projects (KPI 23). The important amount of ineligible costs is notably due to budgetary and accounting irregularities (financial reporting), wrong application of tendering and contracting EU procedures and lack of supporting documentation. Because of travel restrictions due to the COVID-19 crisis, especially during the first part of the year, the majority of ex- ante controls took the form of desk reviews, but field visits resumed later in the year to further reinforce the control work.

#### 4.1.1.2. Results of external audits

The financial audits executed in 2022 identified a very high amount of ineligible expenses, totalling  $\leqslant$  631,633, representing 20.56% of the total amount audited of  $\leqslant$ 3,071,628 (KPI 27). This important amount of ineligible costs is mainly due to the misuse of tendering/contractual procedures, misinterpretation of rules, lack of documentation and incorrect financial reporting.

It has to be noted that this high amount and percentage still represent a significant decrease compared to the previous reporting year (€ 1,971,599 and 42.85%, respectively). This is due to the mitigating actions that stemmed from the analysis of the situation. The OPER and FCA sections increased their technical and financial support to project beneficiaries in order to

prevent errors and irregularities. The EUD ensured a proper follow-up of auditors' findings, including recovery of undue paid amounts when necessary.

## **4.1.2.** Fraud prevention, detection and correction

In the management of the EUTF, the EUD is following the anti-fraud strategy of DG INTPA. All colleagues forming part of the financial circuits and in supporting roles are informed about this strategy and are aware of their role in fraud prevention, detection and correction.

In the reporting year, one case with a high number and amount of irregularities identified by the auditors was reported to OLAF.

# 4.2 Observations and recommendations made by Internal Audit Service

Nothing to report.

# 4.3 Assessment of the effectiveness of the internal control systems/EU Court of Auditors

Internal controls demonstrated to be very effective. Procurement, contractual and financial circuits have been fully respected. Project verification processes (an appropriate mix of audits, ex-ante controls, monitoring, on-the-spot visits)

allowed identifying € 1 million of errors and irregularities in the application of EC procedures (misuse of tendering processes and wrong interpretation of contractual provisions in some projects). During the year, OPER and FCA sections reinforced their support to implementing partners to help them in the application of corrective measures (reorientation or reduction of activities, budgetary reallocations, application of correct procedures, conformity of financial reporting, etc.).

## 4.4 Conclusions as regards assurance

The resources assigned to the EUTF activities described in the report have been used for their intended purpose. The regularity and the legality of tendering, contractual and financial operations has been ensured. Despite the difficult working conditions as a consequence of the pandemic, operation and financial staff has demonstrated a high level of responsibility and professional commitment. Internal controls, rules and procedures have been correctly applied. The principles of equality of treatment and impartiality have been fully respected. Based on the excellent results achieved and the quality of work performed, reasonable assurance can be given.

The intervention is aligned with the Government's "Peace with Legality" Policy and gives regional institutions, especially the Territorial Renovation Agency (ART), a central role in implementation, thus fostering institutional coordination. It focuses on value chains: cocoa in Putumayo and Tumaco (Nariño), and dairy in Caquetá, integrating the following lines of action:

(i) improve rural roads in areas with potential to develop production chains; (ii) strengthen processing and marketing companies integrated to chains; (iii) promotion to technological innovation applied to value chains; (iv) partnerships between the various steps and actors of the production chains.

In addition, an Investment Fund, a Business Development Services Fund, and a Technical Assistance Facility will be available. In a transversal way, work will be made by applying the gender approach in implementation, to promote women empowerment in the two production chains, with an emphasis on their equitable participation in the expected improvements, and greater control of the processes and benefits created.




