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1. Policy and operational highlights of the year

1.1. Policy and operational highlights

Since the Fund is in its closing period, most of the operational activities in 2024 were focused on advancing with the closing of projects and maximising sustainability of the actions, in a context of uncertain progress in the new peace negotiations promoted by the Petro administration, and complicated by a worsening security situation in most of the territories of intervention. The closing of projects was carried out from the perspective of capitalising on achievements and experiences to articulate processes with the new European Union programming, as well as transferring results to government entities and other institutions.

Under the administration of the government of President Gustavo Petro, during 2024, work was conducted on important fronts to foster the implementation of the peace agreement. In October 2024, the government presented a “shock plan” to accelerate the implementation of the Final Peace Agreement, focusing on comprehensive rural reform, security in conflict zones and territorial transformation. As part of this exercise, the Framework Implementation Plan of the agreement was updated.

The two Budget Support programmes, one on Land Reforms and one on Reincorporation of peace signatories, have completed their evaluation period. Concerning comprehensive rural reform, the public policy promoted processes of land titling and the effective allocation of resources for the development of productive projects. In this period, 11

peasant reserve zones were approved in eight departments. The reports are going to be evaluated and the corresponding disbursement processed in 2025.

Support for national reincorporation policies through the Budget Support, and the Technical Assistance, to the implementation of the National Policy on Social and Economic Reincorporation, reinforced key aspects of the reincorporation process, including socio-economic integration of peace signatories, through support to individual and collective productive projects, access to land and housing, healthcare, strengthening leadership skills of signatories, and promoting their involvement in local development policies, among other areas. The Budget support programme also strengthened intersectoral articulation among different state entities with shared responsibility in the implementation of the policy.

Through the Land Budget Support, which prioritises the departments of Caquetá and Meta, important progress was made in consolidating “Pato-Balsillas” and “Losada-Guayabero” peasant reserves, two areas characterized by high levels of conflict and restrictive environmental legislation for land use. This included the approval of two integrated rural development projects to support the dairy chain development and bean and coffee production. The budget support facilitated inter-institutional coordination and the flow of public investments for the implementation of productive projects in these areas. The

Reincorporation Budget Support kept providing support to the implementation of the national reincorporation policy, as the new comprehensive reincorporation program and the sustainability strategy for productive projects were approved.

In 2024, linking the results of the EUTF interventions with public policy was essential. In this regard, progress was made in supporting the formulation of an investment project to access royalty resources to enable the implementation of actions of the Putumayo gender equality public policies. In addition, the elaboration of the Action and Follow-up Plans (PAS) of the Gender Equality Policies to improve policy internal management, monitoring and effective implementation was accompanied.

Rutas PDET also completed most operations during the year, with some marginal activities continuing during the earlier part of 2025. This project set an important model of local development combining sustainable value chains, conservation, gender and access to finance through impact investment. This model has been taken as a reference to develop the “territorial integrative projects” of the Territory Renewal Agency (ART) in Caquetá and Putumayo which are expected to mobilise substantial national funding and political support.

Furthermore, the Rutas PDET programme has consolidated and validated a model that not only enables bottom-up planning but also facilitates the implementation of the planned actions. The support provided to the Community Action Boards and local organizations for the execution of various infrastructure projects and the dissemination of plant materials not only built capacities within local organizations but also optimized the use of resources. These organizations received constant support for the preparation of progress reports, audits, and the financial management of contracts awarded through Third-Party Financial Support.



In addition, in order to share instruments or models to be replicated by other actors, in 2024 a model for strengthening productive chains with a gender approach was developed based on the experience of the PDT Nariño project, as well as the systematization of the inter-institutional coordination process for the territorialisation of the national guidelines on gender equality. Two collaboration agreements were signed with the National Library of Colombia and the Compaz Foundation - Open Library of the Peace Process for the dissemination of EUTF products.

During 2024, two landmark projects of the European Trust Fund for Peace - Mascapaz and Mujeres que Transforman – completed operational implementation during the year with significant results. Mascapaz was very successful in consolidating experiences in sustainable territorial planning and development, including elements of land formalization and tenure, sustainable production models, ecosystem conservation and restoration, as well as direct work with communities and particularly with young people. Mujeres que Transforman was very instrumental in promoting peace as well as women economic and democratic empowerment in Putumayo, one of the most conflict affected departments.

Maintaining a strong Team Europe spirit remains crucial to project the EU and its Member States as a unified political and financial partner in advancing global peace processes. This includes the implementation of the 2016 Peace Agreement in Colombia and any new

agreements emerging from ongoing negotiations. The proposed approach emphasizes continued collaboration under the Team Europe Initiative, integrating peacebuilding and security interventions through a cohesive and strategic framework.

In 2025, the **Global Gateway** will be instrumental in mobilizing domestic and international funds, fostering climate finance, and attracting impact investments. These efforts aim to scale up transformative cooperation projects, particularly in areas such as renewable energy, digital connectivity, and sustainable infrastructure. Leveraging these investments to bridge social and territorial disparities is critical to addressing the root causes of conflict and ensuring long-term stability in Colombia.

Moreover, the EU and its Member States will align with updated global frameworks, such as the Paris Agreement and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), to ensure that peace and development efforts are resilient to emerging challenges like climate change, digital divides, and geopolitical shifts. By strengthening partnerships with local stakeholders, international organizations, and the private sector, Team Europe will further enhance its role as a catalyst for sustainable peace and inclusive development.

For 2025, it is planned to consolidate scenarios and tools for transferring of experiences to further impact on public policies, as well as on the continuity and sustainability of the European Peace Facility actions.

1.2. Summary of programmes adopted and current pipeline

As at 31 December 2024, 21 contracts are ongoing, between existing projects, others which have not yet been closed due to administrative matters (pending audits, recoveries, etc.), service contracts and expenditure verifications. Please find below a list of them:

As regards the budget, out of the Fund's EUR 135 million (total amount between operational and administrative items), EUR 128 million has been committed at operational level only, corresponding to 95.2 % of that total amount. Of the amount committed, EUR 117.9 million, corresponding to 91.4 %, has been paid. It is important to clarify that both commitments and payments include only operational expenditure, i.e. those related to the implementation of the projects and associated contracts, the administrative aspect has not been taken into account in this report.

Addendum 1 to the action document extended the date of finalisation of activities to June 30, 2025, considering the projects' difficulties in achieving results within the timeframe of their original contracts. The modification of the operational implementation end date (LMO-EOI) is not among the essential elements of the financing decision as defined in Article 110 of the FR (see chapter 7.3.4. A9—Addendum), and therefore the HoD can make this decision.

1.3. Obstacles encountered

In 2024, significant obstacles in implementing programmes in Colombia were encountered. The ongoing volatility of the peace process, under the Petro administration, proved to be a major challenge, as fragile ceasefire agreements and sporadic outbreaks of violence undermined the stability needed for successful programme implementation. In addition, the persistent threats to ex-FARC-EP combatants and the continued influence of non-state armed groups further hindered progress, particularly in regions with contested control, pushing the ETCR¹ of Miravalle to be relocated in 2024, and others before that. The

presence of organised criminal networks, deeply rooted in both rural and urban areas, disrupted development initiatives, heightened security risks, and fuelled mistrust in the peace process.

Among main challenges in the implementation of the reincorporation policy, difficulties in access to land presented obstacles to the sustainability of productive projects and a limitation in access to housing.

Institutional and governance variability also presented significant barriers. Coordination issues affected the execution of critical projects such as the land budgetary support, reincorporation projects, among others.

1.4. Particular risks associated with the management of EUTF programmes

The main risks of EUTF programmes in Colombia were shaped by the evolving peace negotiations under the Petro administration. While the government has prioritised dialogues with various non-state armed groups, including the ELN and other dissident factions, the fluidity of ceasefire agreements and persistent threats to ex-FARC-EP combatants remain significant challenges. These issues are compounded by the entrenched presence of criminal networks in both urban and rural areas, which undermine security and development efforts. To address these risks, the EUTF has carried out a strategy to share results with different agencies and stakeholders, fostering collaborative learning and coordination. This effort aims to enhance the sustainability of interventions and ensure their alignment with national peacebuilding objectives.

Additionally, climate change presents a systemic, high-level risk to EUTF-supported activities, particularly as Colombia grapples with the ongoing impacts of El Niño. High temperatures, prolonged droughts, and wildfires are disrupting livelihoods and threatening the success of productive initiatives. These climate-induced challenges exacerbate socioeconomic vulnerabilities, including displacement, food insecurity, and loss of income sources. In response, the EUTF has embedded climate-smart strategies and mitigation measures into project design to bolster resilience and sustainability.

The Petro administration's commitment to sustainable development and rural reforms also underscores the need for EUTF projects to align with long-term sustainability goals. Achievements must be secured through capacity-building initiatives, community ownership of development processes, and integration of projects into national and local frameworks. Enhanced monitoring and adaptive management strategies will ensure that the progress achieved under the EUTF continues to generate tangible, lasting benefits for Colombia, while maintaining the trust and support of the European Union and other international partners.

2. Programming, implementation and results, including evaluations

2.1. Brief description of programmes adopted

No new programmes were adopted in 2024.

2.2. Monitoring and lessons learnt

Regarding the lessons learned, the achievements of the Project 06-41 Mujeres que Transforman have been strengthened through a sequential, parallel and synergistic form of civil society represented by the Tejedoras de Vida Alliance and the public institutionalism related to the country's gender policies like the Presidential Advisory Board for Women and the Gender Sub-directorate of the DNP. Not only this, but the local institutionalism has also played a role with the presence of Social Managers and the Gender Secretariat and the Gender Liaisons of the Municipalities involved. These interventions have created important spaces for the aforementioned national entities to approach the needs and priorities of women in a territory that

is generally underserved, strengthening their relationships with local entities along the way and, at the same time, promoting a better positioning of their counterparts at the municipal level. This experience is a good example of how to put into practice in small municipalities the national guidelines on gender equality, and how the promotion of gender equality for Putumayo women has contributed to strengthening and legitimizing the presence of the State in that territory. In this same context, a quick systematization of the inter-institutional articulation process of this experience was developed in order to share this experience with different decision-makers and implementers of interventions for gender equality.

Additionally, the construction of the Model for strengthening productive chains with a gender focus was carried out based on the experience developed by the PDT Nariño Fund project and presented in a didactic format. In this knowledge management exercise, it was found that the PDT Nariño experience is a very valuable experience, which provides valuable elements on how to work on gender equity in production chains, evidencing multiple positive changes in the lives of women producers, their homes and their organizations, both in masculinized chains and in those with a mixed composition. The correct choice of modelling this experience results in a document that establishes the Model for promoting production chains from a gender perspective, providing a practical guide that raises awareness and guides other actors, both in cooperation and civil society, to undertake agricultural and production chain development from equity. The modelling also shows the added value of working from gender equity, not only to accelerate the processes of productive and socio-business change, but also to generate more sustainable processes.

Furthermore, a ROM (Results Oriented Monitoring) evaluation was carried out

on the Technical Assistance for the Land Policy Implementation contract, where it was found that there is a logical framework for guidance that has some space for improvement of the progress measures, the intervention has been able to adapt to substantial changes of external nature, giving a good projection to meet the commitments established, and there has been installed capacities within the institutional and organizational practices of the target groups.

Lastly, the EUTF team carried out several monitoring field visits of projects like the T06.60-61-62 Rutas PDET in Tumaco and Caquetá, T06.94 Piscicultura del Común in Meta, Guajira, Cesar, T06.04 Mascapaz in Meta, T06.41 Mujeres que Transforman in Putumayo, and the T06.73 Land Budgetary Support.

2.3. Main achievements of the EUTF

To obtain a consolidated overview of the EUTF actions, targets and results of the projects of the Trust Fund have been grouped in six main Strategic Pillars. Below, the main indicators for each Strategic Pillar are presented.

PILLAR 6: ADDED VALUE OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

The EUTF has transferred specific expertise and experience from EU and EU Member States such as:

- LEADER approach, putting forward European added values related to the promotion of alternative energies, ecotourism, green business and biotrade, river basin development, youth and volunteering, and innovation and technology.
- The focus on commercialisation and markets, achieving the adoption of agricultural practices and certification models complying with European Standards.

The added value of the EUTF relies on two areas: in the political sphere, it has served as an effective platform for the dissemination of democratic values and the principles on which the construction of a lasting peace is based; and in the technical field it has contributed to the strengthening of capacities of the executing and co-executing entities.





2.4. EUTF Visibility

In 2024, the communications efforts of the European Union Trust Fund for Colombia (EUTF) emphasized the visibility of key strategic pillars: reconciliation, conflict reduction, and the reincorporation of former FARC-EP members. These efforts included notable initiatives and activities communicated through EUTF and European Union Delegation channels, as well as through allied media like *El Espectador*, and highlighted during strategic events.

The commemoration of the eighth anniversary of the Peace Agreement was a central focus, marked by the European tour of the “Colectivo Miradas” a photography project led by peace signers. The tour, conducted in Brussels and Ghent (Belgium) and Madrid (Spain), showcased the reincorporation and peacebuilding process through artistic expression. It promoted a

narrative against stigmatization of peace signers and fostered reconciliation in conflict-affected territories. Key exhibits included the *Semillas de Paz* (2024) photography exhibition and the screening of the documentaries *Miradas* (2021) and *La Montaña* (2022), which originated from documentary photography workshops supported by the EUTF since 2021. This tour positioned the *Miradas* Collective as a significant achievement of the Peace Agreement’s reincorporation process, demonstrating the role of art in bridging divides. It also raised awareness among strategic societal actors and international stakeholders about the ongoing challenges of Peace Agreement implementation. The tour involved meetings with Colombian ambassadors to Belgium and Spain, European Parliament members, Adrianus Koetsenruijter (European Union Special Envoy for Peace in Colombia), media

representatives, European authorities, and organizations.

In addition to the Miradas tour, EUTF projects demonstrated tangible results, including the T06.41 Mujeres que Transforman initiative, which facilitated an exchange in Mexico where women from Putumayo shared their project's success with Mexican organizations. Similarly, members of the cooperative Economías Sociales del Común (ECOMUN), participating in the T06.94 Piscicultura del Común project, undertook a technical and management capacity-building tour in Italy to strengthen their skills and explore European market opportunities for pisciculture initiatives. Other projects such as T06.04 Mascapaz, T06.39 Aremos Paz, and T06.60.61.62 Rutas PDET concluded with the presentation of impactful results, further underscoring the EUTF's contributions to peace and development.

EUTF's participation in strategic events highlighted its multifaceted impact. During Europe Day in Caquetá, visits showcased the achievements of local initiatives supported by the Fund. At COP16, the EUTF reaffirmed its commitment to environmental conservation and sustainable peacebuilding. In the Blue

Zone, it participated in discussions on transforming food systems and preserving biodiversity in the cocoa sector, while in the Green Zone, initiatives from Caquetá and Putumayo were featured in the Biodiverse Economies Fair.

Throughout the year, the EUTF maintained a strong digital presence. Thirty-six articles detailing its projects, including case reviews, were published on its website. By November 30, 2024, the site had registered 42,310 visits, 116,771 interactions, and 15,797 active users, consolidating its role as a crucial platform for showcasing the Fund's achievements.

Since 2021, the Cinema and Photography for Peace initiatives have fostered community storytelling, reaching over 500 participants in six departments through workshops and local tours. These activities have created spaces for dialogue between individuals once divided by conflict, using art as a medium to build trust and understanding. By leveraging artistic expression, international collaboration, and strategic communication, the EUTF reinforced its role as a pivotal actor in promoting peace, reconciliation, and sustainable development in Colombia.

4. Management and internal control

4.1 Control results

4.1.1. Control effectiveness as regards legality and regularity

4.1.1.1. Results of ex-ante controls

Ex-ante controls demonstrated to be effective with €384,133 of undue payments identified, representing 1.99% of the total amount paid in 2022 for EUTF projects (KPI 23). The important amount of ineligible costs is notably due to budgetary and accounting irregularities (financial reporting), wrong application of tendering and contracting EU procedures and lack of supporting documentation. Because of travel restrictions due to the COVID-19 crisis, especially during the first part of the year, the majority of ex-ante controls took the form of desk reviews, but field visits resumed later in the year to further reinforce the control work.

4.1.1.2. Results of external audits

The financial audits executed in 2022 identified a very high amount of ineligible expenses, totalling € 631,633, representing 20.56% of the total amount audited

of €3,071,628 (KPI 27). This important amount of ineligible costs is mainly due to the misuse of tendering/contractual procedures, misinterpretation of rules, lack of documentation and incorrect financial reporting.

It has to be noted that this high amount and percentage still represent a significant decrease compared to the previous reporting year (€ 1,971,599 and 42.85%, respectively). This is due to the mitigating actions that stemmed from the analysis of the situation. The OPER and FCA sections increased their technical and financial support to project beneficiaries in order to prevent errors and irregularities. The EUD ensured a proper follow-up of auditors' findings, including recovery of undue paid amounts when necessary.

4.1.2. Fraud prevention, detection and correction

In the management of the EUTF, the EUD is following the anti-fraud strategy of DG INTPA. All colleagues forming part of the financial circuits and in supporting roles are informed about this strategy and are aware of their role in fraud prevention, detection and correction.

In the reporting year, one case with a high number and amount of irregularities identified by the auditors was reported to OLAF.

4.2 Observations and recommendations made by Internal Audit Service

Nothing to report.

4.3 Assessment of the effectiveness of the internal control systems/EU Court of Auditors

Internal controls demonstrated to be very effective. Procurement, contractual and financial circuits have been fully respected. Project verification processes (an appropriate mix of audits, ex-ante controls, monitoring, on-the-spot visits) allowed identifying € 1 million of errors and irregularities in the application of EC procedures (misuse of tendering processes and wrong interpretation of contractual

provisions in some projects). During the year, OPER and FCA sections reinforced their support to implementing partners to help them in the application of corrective measures (reorientation or reduction of activities, budgetary reallocations, application of correct procedures, conformity of financial reporting, etc.).

4.4 Conclusions as regards assurance

The resources assigned to the EUTF activities described in the report have been used for their intended purpose. The regularity and the legality of tendering, contractual and financial operations has been ensured. Despite the difficult working conditions as a consequence of the pandemic, operation and financial staff has demonstrated a high level of responsibility and professional commitment. Internal controls, rules and procedures have been correctly applied. The principles of equality of treatment and impartiality have been fully respected. Based on the excellent results achieved and the quality of work performed, reasonable assurance can be given.





3. Estabilización territorial mediante el fortalecimiento de cadenas productivas, mejor acceso a recursos, servicios, infraestructura y mercados – Rutas PDET

General Description

- **Start date: 18/07/2020**
- **End date: 30/04/2025**

The intervention is aligned with the Government's "Peace with Legality" Policy and gives regional institutions, especially the Territorial Renovation Agency (ART), a central role in implementation, thus fostering institutional coordination. It focuses on value chains: cocoa in Putumayo and Tumaco (Nariño), and dairy in Caquetá, integrating the following lines of action:

- (i) Improve rural roads in areas with potential to develop production chains; (ii) strengthen processing and marketing companies integrated to chains; (iii) promotion to technological innovation applied to value chains; (iv) partnerships between the various steps and actors of the production chains.

In addition, an Investment Fund, a Business Development Services Fund, and a Technical Assistance Facility will be available. 




